The bestselling author of *The Invisible Bridge* discusses her new novel based on the true story of Varian Fry's extraordinary attempt to save the work, and the lives, of Jewish artists fleeing the Holocaust. In 1940, Fry, an American journalist, traveled to



France with a list of imperiled artists and writers he hoped to rescue within a few weeks. Instead, he ended up staying for thirteen months to procure false documents, amass emergency funds, and set up an underground railroad where the refugees embarked for safer ports. Among his many clients were Hannah Arendt, Marcel Duchamp, and Marc Chagall.

Julie Orringer will be joined in conversation with Megan O'Grady, writer at large at T: The New York Times Style Magazine, and a lecturer at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago.




